## **PROLIFIC DISTRACTION BURGLAR ORDERED TO PAY BACK ILL- GOTTEN GAINS**

A prolific burglar who committed more than 100 burglaries has

been ordered to pay back over £110,000 of his ill-gotten gains.

13 of these offences were within the Aylesbury Vale.

William Vinson, aged 59, of Cotswold Terrace, Chipping Norton, Oxfordshire, was convicted in January 2012 at Oxford Crown Court of committing more than 100 distraction burglaries in Berkshire, Oxfordshire, Buckinghamshire, Wiltshire, Northamptonshire, Gloucestershire, Warwickshire, Leicestershire and in the West Mercia Police area.

He was sentenced to nine years imprisonment.

Following his conviction, Thames Valley Police's Economic Crime Unit began an investigation into Vinson's financial affairs, and discovered he had 50 per cent equity of a property in Banbury.

A confiscation hearing was brought against Vinson under the Proceeds of Crime Act and was heard at Oxford Crown Court yesterday (28/6). The Judge agreed that his benefit from his criminal conduct was £148,136.08, the amount available was £112,676.46, and the confiscation order was made in that amount.

From this amount, £28,953 in compensation will be paid to his victims.

Vinson has six months to pay the confiscation order or serve a further two and a half years in default on top of his nine-year sentence and still have to pay back the cash.

## **CRIME FIGURES**

Crime figures for the Haddenham Neighbourhood - 01/04/2012 to 31/05/2012 compared to the same period last year have shown a total decrease in crime of 25.4% (19 less crimes reported)

Theft from Vehicle – 4 offences compared to 6 offences the previous period last year.

Burglary – 5 offences compared to 6 the previous period last year.

An increase of Burglary non dwelling (business premises & sheds) – 9 offences compared to 6 the previous period last year (continue to lock up items in the garden and secure ladders, scrap, bikes and garden shed doors)

We have had no Robberies in the area for over 3 years which is great news.

## OVER 180 PEOPLE ARRESTED FOR DRINK DRIVING IN THE THAMES VALLEY

Roads policing officers have arrested 182 people on suspicion of drink-driving as part of the summer drink-drive campaign.

The summer drink-drive campaign was launched on June 1 and is aimed at targeting drink and drug drivers over the summer months. Across the Thames Valley, there have been 182 arrests relating to driving while under the influence of alcohol.

Of those arrested, 142 were men [78 per cent] and 40 were women [22 per cent]. The oldest was a 77-year-old man arrested in Marlow on Thursday (21/6) and the youngest an 18-year-old woman in Buckingham on Tuesday (19/6), and an 18-year-old man in Milton Keynes on Tuesday 5 June. The average age of those arrested was 34. In total, 104 of the 182 arrested have been charged, with 42 bailed and 36 released with no further action.

This year's campaign arrests show a 16 per cent decrease on the 216 arrests made during the same period in 2011.

The campaign, which runs until the end of June, will see police targeting individuals they suspect of driving under the influence of drink or drugs, both on the way home from nights out and the morning after a heavy night. Of the arrests, 72 have been made in Berkshire, 59 in Buckinghamshire and 51 in Oxfordshire.

Superintendent Chris Brown, head of Roads Policing for Hampshire Constabulary and Thames Valley Police, said: "182 people arrested for drink driving shows the large number of people still willing to put themselves before everyone else's safety." "People still aren't getting the message and yet we know drinking while over the limit is causing fatal collisions, we know that any amount of alcohol affects your ability to drive and we know that if you're caught drink-driving you will be banned from driving.

"We'll continue to target drink drivers hard and get them before the courts whenever we can."
